## From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

May God's blessing and protection be upon you!

I first want to thank you for a wonderful first month serving with you here in Conrad at First Presbyterian Church. I've been blessed by a number of you in various ways including through help in unloading upon arrival, being oriented to Conrad and places beyond, serving with you in various ways, and being guided through your comments and encouragement. Thank you!

I've joked with a couple of you in saying that I worry I've scared the people of Conrad. I arrived and about 2 weeks later, the entire city seems to be locking themselves in their homes. Actually, I think it's even state-wide, but I haven't made it out of Conrad recently.

We live in extraordinary times. I had the blessing of worshipping with you twice before we had to move worship online due to the COVID-19 pandemic that is sweeping the world and is now in at least two bordering counties of Montana. I've generally had positive feedback regarding the online services and plan to continue those. If you struggle to access them, please let me know. I want to provide you an effective way of worshipping God in this unusual time.

I know some of you do not have the ability to join us over the internet, and I've been working on a solution. I've been able to setup a conference call system with which I will play the recording to those who join on Sundays from 11:30 am. It will play announcements, the Gospel reading, and the sermon before disconnecting. You may access this from your regular phone by dialing 978-990-5110. When requested for the access code dial 749966# (do make sure to enter the #-sign). We'll mail the bulletin to people we think might struggle with access, but please do call the church office to make sure you're on the list if you need this.

We've also collected some resources you might find useful on the website for your personal or family spiritual development, maintaining social connections, and keeping your children (or yourselves) busy at home. These are available in a couple pages under the Resources page on the website.

Periods such as these can be anxious times. A world that once seemed in many ways tamed now seems out-of-control. This has impacted our health, our financial well-being, and our ability to remain socially connected. I invite you to follow the guidance our health and political leaders have given so that we can limit the impact to our healthcare system and limit the time we are at greatest risk. I, also, invite you to take time to nourish yourself spiritually and mentally.

The most basic confession in the Christian church is "Jesus is Lord" and comes from Romans 10:9. It speaks to the authority and deity of Jesus. Jesus, though, is not just a lord or king from an earthly sense. Matthew 28:18 informs us that "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to [Jesus]." Our Lord remains in control, and he is a loving Lord. As I shared in my recent sermon, Jesus remains concerned about our well-being. It is right for us to look to state and national leaders to find a solution to our current circumstances, but one more powerful and more knowledgeable and more skilled is already at work to bring the Kingdom of Heaven into being here on earth. A place where we will have no need to be anxious. I invite you with the Lord's Prayer to continue praying "your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

I look forward to a day when we can worship in person together again, but let us remember what we celebrate on Easter. Jesus has risen, and he will come again. He remains in power even today from heaven. He was crucified, but death could not hold him. Jesus, our Lord, triumphed even over death, and we will see his triumph over COVID-19.

#### **Session Highlights**

#### March 2020

- 1. Pastor Smothers met with Pastor Nelson from Pondera Valley Lutheran Church and it was decided that due the COVID-19 concerns the Lenten Luncheons would be canceled for two weeks (March 18<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>).
- 2. Glacier Presbytery has required congregations to develop a COVID-19 response plan, and the session of FPC has formed a task force to make rapid decisions during this time. This Task Force will help with decisions, coordinate communication and invite people into service as the circumstances require. This Task Force consists of two elders, Jay Taylor and Marla Bruner and one deacon, Della Kellogg, along with Pastor Smothers.
- 3. It was decided by the Session that Pastor Smothers would mail a letter to the members and friends of the congregation telling what decisions the Session has made regarding COVID-19, how we as a church family will hold services in a different setting and remind everyone that although some things have changed the need to tithe has not.
- 4. With sad hearts the Session made the decision to suspend Wednesday Church School and Logos Youth Group for the remaining program weeks and to hold Sunday Church Services in an alternate way for the next two Sundays (March 22<sup>nd</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup>). The newly formed Task Force will assess the COVID-19 situation and extended the church service alternative additional weeks as necessary.

Operating Expenses: \$ 15,935

Balance: \$ -6,895

Year-to-Date Balance: \$ 5,074

The Property Committee reports:

- 1. The new carpet has been installed in the entryway and pastor's office and all looks very nice.
- 2. A new faucet was installed in the sink in Room 3 of the Christian Education Building.

The Worship Committee reports:

  - b. Easter Sunday, April 12<sup>th</sup>
